### **INCOME TAX PROGRAM** It is that time of the year; time to file your 2023 Income Tax Return!

A Community Volunteer Income Tax Program in collaboration with Canada Revenue Agency is available to **indi**viduals with low to modest income for those with a "simple" tax situation, i.e. no self-employment or business income or expenses, no capital gains or losses or bankruptcy files.

This service is **offered BY APPOINTMENT only** from our office located at 106 McGonigal Street West, Arnprior. We will be open to accept 2023 Income Tax forms beginning **March 1, 2024**, **until April 29, 2024**.

The service is offered **Mondays**, **Wednesdays**, and **Fridays between the hours of 10:00am and 2:00pm**. Please use side window to drop off your income tax documents and follow the signs.

### A DAY IN THE LIFE OF A LOCAL SENIOR

#### Meet local area resident Joan Marcellus.

Born in Winnipeg to George and Alma Butler, Joan and her brother Don enjoyed a great childhood filled with fond memories of the West and the Sioux Lookout.

As a young woman, she worked in various grocery stores as a cashier and took great pleasure in making people smile. In 1965. she joined her family who relocated to the Arnprior area a few

years earlier and hasn't looked back!

She spent 15 years working for Union Carbide, now known as Nylene as a quality control technician. It was while working at Nylene, that through her brother & sister-in-law that she met the love of her life, Joe Marcellus. Together they raised their beautiful girl Pam. In 1980, she and Joe purchased Wall's Dairy, renamed it to BJ & Joe's where they distributed Sealtest dairy products to schools, restaurants & corner stores. After selling in 1988, they decided to purchase the Centre Town Coin Wash.

Later in life, she worked as a personal support worker which she thoroughly enjoyed. She knew from experience that working with seniors gave her satisfaction and a sense of purpose. In fact, even after working as a PSW, she dedicated her time to volunteering with Seniors At Home in the Footcare clinic and as Friendly Visitor as well as the Opportunity shop where she continues to volunteer when possible.

When asked about her fondest historical memory, she was quick to mention that meeting John F. Kennedy while visiting a University in Orono, Maine. As for her thoughts of technological advancements, she expressed astonishment at the impact on today's youth. The fact that so many struggle telling time, recalling times tables without a smartphone or understanding how to read a handwritten letter is bewildering to say the least. In her opinion, this world can use more compassion.

When asked about what brings her joy, she said she always loved to travel and shared fond memories of her time in Florida with the girls, away from our cold winter weather. While age comes with a price, and travelling may not be in the cards today, Joan still enjoys volunteering, spending time with her daughter and grandchildren and participating in social events such as our Annual Christmas Party and the Summer BBQ in the Park.

If you're fortunate enough to know Joan, then count yourself lucky. If you don't, and need a little pick-me-up, then I encourage you to introduce yourself while at one of our events. She truly is a kind, compassionate woman with a great sense of humour that even those in the medical profession could attest to!

## DID YOU KNOW??

#### All About the Ontario Photo Card

If you are a resident of Ontario and you don't have a driver's license, or you're looking for an additional form of government-issued ID, the Ontario Photo Card might be the solution for you.

### What is the Ontario Photo Card?

An Ontario Photo Card is a government-issued identification card that is available to Ontario residents who **do not have a driver's license**. It is useful for identification purposes, such as when opening a bank account, voting, or accessing government services.

### Who is eligible for an Ontario Photo Card?

Ontario residents who are 16 years of age or older and do not have a driver's license are eligible to apply for the Card.

### How do I apply for an Ontario Photo Card?

You can apply for an Ontario Photo Card by visiting a <u>Service Ontario</u> location in person. You will need to bring original documents that prove your identity, such as a birth certificate or passport, and your residency in Ontario, such as a utility bill or lease agreement.
